

The Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows has origins going back to the earliest days of Ukrainian settlement in Saskatchewan when, in 1909, a beautiful woman in white appeared to three children on the hill. It is the second oldest Shrine in Saskatchewan and the only one associated with a story of an apparition. We honor the Mother of God there each year. You should too!

The Divine Mercy Novena

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy can be said anytime, but Our Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena from **Good Friday to Divine Mercy Sunday** (**the Sunday after Easter Sunday**). He promised: "By this Novena I will grant every possible grace to souls."

INTENTIONS: For each of the nine days, Our Lord gave St. Faustina a different intention: (Day 1) All mankind, especially sinners; (Day 2) the souls of priests and religious; (Day 3) all devout and faithful souls; (Day 4) those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus; (Day 5) the souls who have separated themselves from the Church; (Day 6) the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children; (Day 7) the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; (Day 8) the souls detained in Purgatory; and (Day 9) the souls who have become lukewarm.

Divine Mercy Sunday: Seek His Mercy

"Where sin is hardest and toughest, there my mercy will be greatest." St. Faustina

The Collect (opening prayer) of today's mass calls us to "grasp and rightly understand in what font we have been washed, by whose Spirit we have been reborn, and by whose Blood we have been redeemed."

- In the font of baptism, we were washed;
- in the Blood of Christ, we are redeemed
- and in the Spirit of Christ, we are reborn.

Today, we celebrate God's uncommon act of forgiving us, removing the punishment due to our sins and also providing us with abundant blessings. God revealed his mercy in sending his onlybegotten Son to become our Lord and Saviour through his suffering, death and resurrection. This mercy of God which is everlasting and endless is a channel through which iniquities are washed away and human race restored back to the original glory.

The gospel tells of how the disciples locked themselves away for the fear of the Jews and the confusion of what might become of them after the death of Jesus. They were afraid, confused, ashamed. Then all of a sudden, Jesus showed up; his first words were not words of rebuke but words of peace: "Peace be with you." He shows them his woundsnot to shame them, but as a proof of his real self. His wounds have become channels of mercy, healing, and new life.

Furthermore, Jesusgave them the power to forgive sins with the words, "Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain, they are retained" (John20:19-23). Thus, instituting the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), a sacrament of Divine Mercy. When Jesus appeared the first time, Thomas was not present; thus, he doubted when other disciples narrated the incidence to him. When Jesus met Thomas rather than rebuke, he showed his 'divine love and mercy' to the doubting Thomas.

The perfect expression of Divine Mercy is through the <u>sacraments</u> which the mother church administers on her children. Weare madeto share in the divine life of Jesus by frequenting the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist.

God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as he does to us. To trust in Jesus also means that we must forgive just as we have been forgiven.

Jesus breathed on the disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:22) The Spirit of God reminds us of our need for God's mercy. When the Spirit of God is not alive in us, we will not see the need for God's mercy. This is manifested in our lack of love and desire to go to God in the sacrament of reconciliation to be washed once again. People object to this sacrament because they believe they cannot tell someone their sins, but when we go to court, our deeds are made known to the judge and public, eventually ending with either acquittal or conviction. In this sacrament of reconciliation, God wants to have a private discussion with us through his ministers, and the verdict is always acquittal – "Go and sin no more" (John 8:11).

The motto of Divine Mercy is "Jesus, I trust in You."

Trust is at the heart of Divine Mercy. One might stretch it to – Jesus, I trust in your love, forgiveness, mercy, healing, protection...etc. Trust will erase our doubts — like Thomas; who when he was convinced (believed) shouted, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28). Trusting means believing that no matter how many times we fall, his mercy is greater. It means daring to open locked doors of our hearts and letting his peace in.
