

4th Sunday of Advent: Son of David

Jesus was the Son of David; this was so because Joseph, was descended from the line of David. David is one of the greatest figures in the Old Testament. He succeeded Saul as King of Israel. It was he who united the scattered tribes and formed them into a nation. Even though he sinned, he repented. Many times, in the Gospel Jesus is referred to as 'Son of David' (Matthew 15:22, Mark 10:47, Luke 18:38).

To say that Jesus came from the line of David was already a great thing. But he is more than that. He has another, and infinitely greater, identity. He is 'Emmanuel', which means 'God is with us' (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 18:23). He is not just the Son of David but also the Son of God. Hence, he is able to save his people from their sins.

The identity of Jesus as the Son of God was something which was gradually revealed and gradually understood. In fact, it was only after he had been raised from the dead that he was accepted as - the Lord.

He himself said this identity could not be recognised unless it was revealed by the Father. This we find in the gospel of Matthew 11:27 – "no one knows the Father except the Son, and no one knows the Son except the Father, and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal Him." It is a matter of faith, which is a gift of God.

Therefore, Jesus is Son of David and Son of God. Then, through our baptism, we have become children of God, which means we also have a divine dignity. "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4). However, our divine dignity, like that of Jesus, is a matter of faith.

Alieutenant was very pleased with the sergeant he had working under him. He was both capable and dependable. But there was one thing he had against him: he was a staunch Christian who lived up to his beliefs.

"By all means," agreed the officer.

So the sergeant turned to the company of soldiers and asked them, "Do you all see the lieutenant...and his feet...and head...and arms?"

"Yes!" they shouted.

"Do you see his brain?"

"No!"

"So.....that proves he doesn't have any."

When they heard that, the soldiers all laughed heartily and even the lieutenant joined in.

Holy Family: Living in love

“You don't choose your family. They are God's gift to you, as you are to them.”

Desmond Tutu

In the family, we learn to bond with others. Here we make room for others (Dad, Mom and children) in our lives. In the family, we learn to share with one another, and become responsible to and for one another.

Family is a bedrock for relationship, here we learn relate with siblings from earliest stage in life. The inability to relate with others in the family, is a great handicap and can cause great distress. Without close (blood) relationships we are at the mercy of the cold winds of anguish and loneliness. Moreso, it is within the family that a child learns to use the word ‘we’ for the first time. Without the word ‘we’ there would be no community, no sharing, no togetherness and ultimately no love.

Canadians plant trees a lot, when I say plant trees – I mean doing it on purpose, hundreds of trees in rows. In the part of Nigeria (southeast) where I am from, we plant fruit-bearing trees; other types of trees basically grow on their own - forming something like rainforest. We do allow that because they serve as protection from strong wind, splashing rain (flood) and are used as plank, timber, wood when needed.

In Canada, if you plant a tree in an exposed place it becomes very vulnerable. It is at the mercy of every wind that blows. So, if you want a tree to grow to its full potential, you must plant it in a more sheltered place. And you must not plant it on its own. You must plant some other trees with it.

Hence, it is important to get the space between those trees right. They must be close enough to be able to provide shelter and protection for one another. Yet they must not be so close that they will stifle one another. They must be planted apart, to ensure that they each has room to grow to its full potential.

Trees planted in the form of a little grove is a good image of the family. In the ideal family, there is both closeness and space. The closeness means the members are able to provide support for one another. The space ensures that they do not stifle one another. Each member has the closeness, intimacy, and warmth that he/she needs, yet also has the space to grow to his/her full potential.

This is a great challenge - how to achieve closeness without stifling or dominating one another. As humans, we have the possibility of helping and healing one another. But we also have the possibility of hindering and hurting one another.

For a desired result, trees should be watered adequately. In the second reading, St. Paul urged us to water our family with - kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, mutual forgiveness, and above all, **love**. These are the virtues which build and foster family.“A family is a place where principles are hammered and honed on the anvil of everyday living.” Charles R. Swindoll

It was by living in a family of love with Mary and Joseph at Nazareth that Jesus was able to grow in wisdom and in favour with God and people. In our society the family is under a lot of pressure and attacks. The value accorded to family is on a free fall. Again, a lot of people are not prepared to keep watering their families with the virtues mentioned by St. Paul in his letter to the Colossians 3:12ff.

When the family is well watered, then we have a home, we have bonds, we have an identity, we have roots and love flourishes.
