



2nd Sunday of Advent: Great promises

"Every year we celebrate the holy season of Advent, O God. Every year we pray those beautiful prayers of longing and waiting, and sing those lovely songs of hope and promise." Karl Rahner

The Bible shows us that God's people are led forward by promises. Promises play a big part in our lives. When you want a child to behave or to do something, you promise the child something. The child is motivated to work or to behave. In adult life promises are still very important. A person buys a 50/50 ticket because he/she believed (promised oneself) in the proximity of being the winner. Married people promise lasting fidelity to one another. Joint Venture Company thrive on the promise of transparency and collaboration towards a single objective. We build our lives on promise, both on promises made to God, others and ourselves.

The Catechism explains that 'promises made to others in God's name engage the divine honor, fidelity, truthfulness, and authority. They must be respected in justice. To be unfaithful to them is to misuse God's name....' (CCC:2147)

In many circumstances, the Christian is called to make promises to God. Baptism and Confirmation, Matrimony and Holy Orders always entail promises. Out of personal devotion, the Christian may also promise to God this action, that prayer, this almsgiving, that pilgrimage, and so forth. Fidelity to promises made to God is a sign of the respect owed to the divine majesty and of love for a faithful God. (CCC:2101)

The Advent messages is hinged on bright promises - promises of the wonderful things that would accompany the coming of the Messiah. As we heard from Prophet Isaiah - mountains would be levelled out, valleys filled in, winding roads made straight, the desert would bloom, the poor would see justice done, the weak would no longer be exploited, war would be banished from the face of the earth. (cf. Isaiah 40:4-5)

A promise gives people hope. It gives them a goal to aim at. It motivates and energises them. It makes them struggle for something. It is the hope of reaching the Promise Land that kept the Israelites focused as they trudge through the desert. And they held on this promise, until it became a reality. This is a good thing. People who have no goal are aimless.

Advent awakens us to the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ as promised. It reveals his true identity and the nature of his mission, which is to establish the Kingdom of God on earth – and this is the heart (centre) of the promises. We, therefore, have a vital part to play in making this Kingdom a reality.

It is not enough to wait for the promises to be fulfilled, we are called to be part of the process. In this way, Advent provides us with a great opportunity to commit ourselves anew to Jesus and his Kingdom.

As long as we have God with us, in our heart and mind, standing by us, we are urged to rekindle our faith and trust in him. He will put away whatever is weighing on our minds and give us the courage to wait on his great promises.
