2nd Sunday: Our Struggles

“The purpose of a good life is not to win the battle, but to wage it unceasingly.” F. McCarthy

Life is full of struggles. However, struggles are an inevitable part of life, often pulling us in so many directions which can lead to a negative mindset if not well managed. Auliq Ice would say, “Life’s struggles are necessary for growth.” They are essential for building character, resilience and personal growth. Life struggles fall into different categories – Financial, Career, Health, Social pressure and Personal struggles. Above all, there is spiritual struggle when it comes to prayer and sin.

The Catechism, giving a broader definition of sin, says, ‘Sin is an offense against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbour caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity.’(CCC: 1849)

It should be noted, sin is not an object that can be removed from us. Moreso, sinfulness is not the same as our sins. The first is the disease, the second the symptoms.

In the gospel, John the Baptist said, ‘here is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world’ (John 1:29). Yes, Jesus does indeed take away our sins in the sense that through him we have forgiveness for our sins, and so are able to put them behind us. When we are forgiven, a very real load, a great burden, is lifted from us, and we are able to go forward freely and joyfully.

Here, Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is a great help. It is a place where we can experience the love of Jesus for us in our sins. It is not an impersonal getting rid of sins. Rather, it is a loving encounter with Jesus our Saviour, who calls us away from sin to goodness of life.

According to the Catechism, ‘Christ has willed that in prayer and life and action his whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation that he acquired for us at the price of his blood. But he entrusted the exercise of the power of absolution to the apostolic ministry which he charged with the “ministry of reconciliation.”(CCC: 1442)

Jesus came not to condemn sinners or keep his distance from them, but to befriend them. In doing this, he revived in them God's gift (goodness) which exists in everyone. Jesus evoked goodness in us to enable us overcome sin. As the saying goes, 'Evil can be overcome only by goodness.'

But we also have to accept responsibility for our sins. And even when we are forgiven, everything doesn't magically come right for us. We don't suddenly become different people. Our old weaknesses, habits and compulsions are still with us. Which means we still have to struggle.

Victory over sin comes about as a struggle. We must not become depressed when we see ourselves making what seems like very little progress. What is important is the struggle for goodness.
