3rd Sunday: Your Word is a lamp

“All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.” (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

The word of God is a lamp kept burning with the oil of the Holy Spirit; it is like the lamps in the sanctuary. The nature of the word of God, and the great intention of giving it to the world; it is a lamp and a light. The word of God discovers to us, that which otherwise we could not have known; it shows us what is amiss. It directs us in our life, work and way.

The word of God must be not only a light to our eyes, to gratify them, and fill our heads with speculations, but a light to our feet and to our path, to direct us in the right ordering of our lives.

Jesus began his preaching with the word, ‘Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand’ (Matthew 4:17). To repent is to admit the darkness in which we are living, and to open ourselves to the light. We show our repentance by a new way of living. We show our repentance by coming out of darkness into the light.

In order to appreciate a light, one must be conscious of one's darkness, and desire to escape from it. One must realise one's need to change, and want to change. Each of us has areas of darkness in our lives - fear, pain, sin, guilt, loneliness, and so on. The word of God shines a pointer on these areas, so that we work on them.

Though the light comes as a friend, it also disturbs because it shows up what is wrong. As letter to the Hebrews tells us, “The word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart” (Hebrews 4:12).

Our society has its dark areas. There still are many people who live in darkness. Fortunately, the lamp Jesus lit continues to burn, a glowing goodness that illuminates the world. It burns in the lives of some of his followers. The light of Jesus did not come to judge us, but to save us, to show us how to live, to show us the way to the Father's Kingdom. “Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path” (Psalm 119:105).

Each of us can be sources of light to a darkened world. Indeed, each of us is called to this task. But unless our own lamp is lit, we won't be able to enlighten anyone else. There is great joy in being in the light. And there is an even greater joy in being a source of light to others. This can be true of us, if we get familiar with the Bible by reading it constantly.

In the olden days before electricity, the streets were lighted by gas lamps. Each evening a lamplighter would go around with a little flame and light one lamp after another.

One evening, Ruskin was sitting in his house looking out the window. Across the valley was a street on the hillside. There Ruskin could see one lamp after another being lighted by the lamplighter as he went along.

Because of the darkness, Ruskin could not see the lamplighter, only his burning torch and the trail of lights he left behind.

Seeing that, Ruskin turned to the person sitting with him and said, "There's a good illustration of a Christian. People may never have known him, they may never have met him, they may never even have seen him. But they know he passed through their world by the trail of light he left behind him."
