## Saints Peter and Paul: The crown of righteousness

We are celebrating the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the great princes of the Church. We are celebrating them for bearing witnesses with their lives. They were human beings like every one of us, but the way and manner they accomplished the mission entrusted to them, made them noble figures of faith.

## **ENCONTER:**

In the gospel of Matthew, when Jesus was in the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "who do you say I am?" Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:15-16).

This merited Peter an automatic leadership, when Jesus said to Peter, 'Simon, son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So, I now say to you; You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld (hell) can never hold out against it(v 17, 18).

Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus entrusted his flock to Peter by requesting him to 'feed his sheep' (John 21:15-17). Peter was not a steady rock, but Jesus was the steady rock on which this *weak rock* was built. This is why the storms and tides of time have not been able to wash it away. If it was to be by human efforts alone, Peter would not have been able to carry the burden of the flock entrusted to him.

St. Paul, on his part, was a later convert. Paul became an apostle when Jesus appeared to him on his way to Damascus, to persecute Christians (Acts9). That singular encounter caused Paul to make a U-turn and join the apostles in preaching the good news.Paul became an apostle through a spiritual encounter while Peter became an apostle through a physical encounter with the Lord.

## MISSION:

Though we celebrate both apostles today, that doesn't mean that life was easy for them. When the Lord laid on the shoulders of Peter the task of leading the fragile Church, he knew it would not be easy, hence why he promised to be with the Church till the end of time (Matthew 28:20).Furthermore, it is possible because Peter's own life was touched by the infinite and unconditional love of Jesus, even in the hour of his failure and denial.

On the mission of making the gospel known to the ends of the world. Peter focused his energy in spreading the gospel within Jerusalem and its surroundings while Paul took the gospel to everywhere beyond - more toward the Gentiles.Paul did his duty of preaching the gospel without looking back (poured out his life like a libation;2 Timothy 4:6).Both Peter and Paul underwent many trials, but they never gave up. It is because of their resilience that we are celebrating them.

## OUR TASK:

The two apostles, Peter and Paul, remind us of the beauty of the Church. God uses every person who is open, as a willing instrument for His glory. We are celebrating them today because of the crown they wore - the crown of righteousness. The only thing that will be remembered after we are gone, is nothing but our crown of righteousness.

We were all crowned with an invisible crown of righteousness when we were baptized (*when the priest anointed our heads* – *scalps*). As disciples of Christ, we are all called to wear the crown of righteousness in the midst of our darkened world. As children of God, we are called to serve the faith of our brothers and sisters, and to walk alongside them, for all of us are "living stones" (1 Peter 2:5), called through our baptism to build God's house in fraternal communion.

Prayer: Thank you, Jesus Thank you, Lord
