A recent update about our designated diocesan sacred sites has been sent. Pilgrims can obtain a Jubilee Indulgence if they meet the conditions outlined by the Church.

To obtain a Jubilee Indulgence for visiting a sacred site, performing works of mercy, and/or undertaking acts of penance the following conditions must be met: detachment from sin, making a sacramental Confession, receiving Holy Communion, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father.

The sacred sites designated by Bishop Mark Hagemoen in the diocese of Saskatoon to visit as part of obtaining a Jubilee Indulgence are:

Two Cathedrals: The Cathedral of the Holy Family, 23 Nelson Road, Saskatoon, and/or St. Paul Co-Cathedral, 720 Spadina Cres. E, Saskatoon. To visit one of these active parish sites:

- · Review the Mass and liturgical schedule on the parish websites.
- · For individual visits, it is not necessary to alert the parish about your planned pilgrimage if you are simply attending a regularly scheduled Mass or confession time.
- · Contact the parish before making any plans for group visits outside of regularly scheduled Mass and confession times, or for special arrangements.

St. Peter's Abbey: The Benedictine Abbey at Muenster, SK is also designated by the bishop as a sacred site to visit for the Jubilee Year indulgence. Please contact the abbey Guest Master at: guestmaster@stpeters.sk.ca or call 306- 682-1775 about possible visits and celebrations as part of obtaining a Jubilee indulgence.

Pentecost Sunday: Revealer of all Truths

"I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified...."

Nicene Creed

The church celebrates today her believe in the Holy Spirit as a Divine Being, the third Person of the Trinity. The Catechism of the Catholic Church in helping us to understand the position and function of the Holy Spirit states, "The Holy Spirit is at work with the Father and the Son from the beginning to the completion of the plan for our salvation. But in these "end times," ushered in by the Son's redeeming Incarnation, the Spirit is revealed and given, recognized and welcomed as a person..." (CCC: 686)

The Holy Spirit is the 'Revealer of all Truths'. He revealed to the apostles the true depth of what Jesus taught them. And led them to all truths or complete truth. This is quite evident in today's gospel – (John 14: 26), Jesus referred to the Holy Spirit as the Advocate, whomthe Father will send in his name; that will reveal (teach, remind) to the apostles the complete truth, which will enable them continue the work of proclamation of the gospel (evangelization).

This is exactly what happened in the first reading (Acts 2:1-11)In actual fact, what the Spirit did was bring out what was already inside the disciples. His love only awakened the 'truth' in them, sothey were able to do things they didn't think they were capable of after the Ascension of Jesus Christ.

The Catechism further elucidated on the mission of the Holy Spirit, "The eternal origin of the Holy Spirit is revealed in his mission in time. The Spirit is sent to the apostles and to the Church both by the Father in the name of the Son, and by the Son in person, once he had returned to the Father...." (CCC: 244).

St. Paul in his letter to the Romans (8:8-17) gave us an insight into the mission of the Holy Spirit. For him, the Holy Spirit reveals the danger of sin. In accusing the world of sin, the Holy Spirit reveals to our spirit the damning damage of a sinful living.

In truth, the Holy Spiritreveals to our spirits, an analysis of sin in its original dimension - there is a constant pressure on humanity to reject God to the point of hating him (*contempt of God*). This pressure on humanity to reject God and the

church, which is his mystical presence in the world, seem to have received its strongest appeal in our world today and particularly, among our younger generation.

For this reason, the Holy Spirit teaches us to be sensitive to subtle maneuvers of the evil one, particularly in his false presentation of sinful habits and lifestyles in the garb of personal freedom and the progressive mindset or wanting to be in tune with modernity.

After Pentecost, the hearts of the apostles were on fire and there was a wind at their backs. We too need the Holy Spirit. We need him to help us to realise the power and the gifts we have within us. We need him to harness that power and release those gifts so that we too can become fearless witnesses for Jesus in our families.

The Holy Spirit today invites us into his fellowship. He calls us to enter into his mystery and have our focus, our will, our heart, mind and body; renewed, strengthened and reformed, to the image and likeness of God the Father.
