The digital culture multiplies connections and offers new opportunities for interaction; yet, the human heart retains an irrevocable need for genuine closeness" (Encyclical Letter, Magnifica Humanitas, 239).

16th Sunday: The wheat and the weed

“It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners.” (Mark 2:17)

It is very easy to describe an earthly kingdom, e.g. Ashanti kingdom, United Kingdom (UK). One can easily talk about: who the king or queen is; how he or she was chosen; geographical area or size of the kingdom; its population; etc. It is very easy to do this, because what we are describing is physical; it can be seen or measured.

But the Kingdom of Heaven is not something physical. It is spiritual; it is a mystery; we can't see everything about it whilst on this earth. Therefore, to explain the mystery of the Kingdom of Heaven, Jesus chooses to use parables. That is, he uses things we know (wheat, weeds, seeds and yeast) to explain what we don't know.

Human beings are complex. They can't be divided into the good and the bad, as though they were two completely separate classes of people. There is no line you can draw which would neatly separate the good from the bad. Any such line would go right through each human heart, for there is good and evil in every heart.

As far as ourselves are concerned, the best thing we can do is take a good look into our own field. If we find some weeds there, as no doubt we will, we should uproot them. If we try to do so, we will discover what a painful process this is.

In Palestine, a poisonous weed known as darnel affects wheat crops. In the early stages of growth, it looks very like the young shoots of wheat. By the time both plants can be distinguished, the roots are so entwined as to make tearing out the darnel very injurious to the wheat.

The Church is a temple with a hundred gates, and pilgrims enter from every angle. Through every door, and from all kinds of paths, we enter the house of God. Ours is not a Church for those who feel good, but for those who know they are not (Matthew 9:13).

We should try to accept sinners as Jesus did. One may ask - Why didn't Jesus weed out Judas? And why didn't he weed out Peter? He saw the weeds in Peter's life, but he saw the wheat too. He knew that with encouragement the wheat would prevail. And it did.

There have always been two views of the Church - one exclusive, the other inclusive. The exclusive view holds that the Church is for good people, for the fully committed. In the inclusive view, the Church must be open to all, to the hot, the cold and the lukewarm, to saints and sinners. For some, the presence of sinners in the Church is a cause of scandal. If they had their way, only saints would be admitted.

But a Church that admitted only saints would make about as much sense as a hospital that admitted only people who are well, or a repair shop that accepted only things that are whole. The Church is not a museum for saints, but a school for sinners.

While we distinguish clearly between good and evil, we must aim at being as understanding and tolerant as God is. The time for judgement is not yet. Now is the time for conversion. People can change. We can change.
