Canada Day Celebration at K of C Blackstrap Camp

14th Sunday: Simplicity of life

'I bless you, Father, for hiding these things from the learned and the clever and revealing them to mere children.' (Matthew 11:25)

When faith is a matter of the head alone, it becomes a cold, intellectual thing. The result is that God remains outside us, a distant, aloof figure. But faith is not just a matter of the head. It is more a matter of the heart. When faith is rooted in the heart, God is seen as close and loving. Then faith becomes a warm relationship with God.

Jesus revealed God as a loving, compassionate, forgiving Father. A God who is passionately interested in us. A God whose concern is not to judge and condemn, but to heal and to save. Some people see God as distant and remote, not really concerned about us and our sufferings. Worse still, others see God as a judge, or a spy ready to pounce and punish.

But the coming of Jesus helped us to stop seeing God as someone remote. We see him as someone who is very close to us, who knows each of us and is concerned about each of us, because we are his children.

Jesus knows the Father and is known by the Father, and because Jesus knows the Father he is able to reveal him to others, especially to those who, like children, are open and receptive.

Many of the wise people rejected Jesus, but the simple people accepted him. The intellectuals had little use for him, but the humble accepted him. Intellectual pride is a dangerous thing. Simple people are often nearer to God than clever people.

Jesus is not condemning intellectual power, but intellectual pride. It is not cleverness that shuts God out; it is pride. And it is not stupidity that enables God to come in; it is humility.

The more space we create for God, the more he takes possession of us, making his home in us and making himself known to us. This is very manifest when one makes a survey of the saints. One striking thing about the saints is the simplicity of their lives and their maturity in the virtue of humility; the simplicity and humility that inspired them to do ordinary things in extraordinary ways.

Only through this simplicity of life and humility of heart can we trust God like children and respond positively to the invitation of Christ today "come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and

learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls” (Matthew 11: 28-30).

This simplicity is borne out of the recognition of the fact that God makes himself known to the simple of heart and this humility springs from our recognition of the fact that we are nothing without God. God is simple and those who seek him must do so in simplicity of life. God is infinitely greater than us and only in humility can we approach the mystery of his being and existence.
