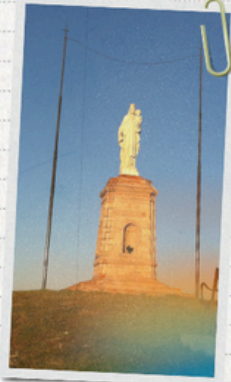

## **The Body and Blood of Christ: Binds us together**

*“Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have receive the bread we offer you, the fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.”***Missal**

The Eucharist is the sign and source of our unity. We form a single body because we all share in the one bread. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explained this in depth, when it said, "The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit." (CCC: 1325)

In the second reading, St. Paul used a loaf of bread as a symbol of our unity in Christ – 'once we were separated from one another, but now we have been gathered together to form the Body of Christ, the Church.' As one body, we become living witnesses of God's desire to bring all peoples and nations together into one family.

Indeed, bread made from wheat, it's a kind of miracle. The grains were once scattered over the fields. But eventually they were brought together and grinded into flour.

Other agents that contributed to the making of this bread include: the soil, the sun, the rain, and people's labour. It comes to us not from one hand but from many hands the hand of the farmer, the hand of the miller, the hand of the baker, the hand of the merchant...

And of course we must not forget God's part in it. Though it is people who bring forth the bread, it is to God that we give thanks. Without God none of this would be possible.

During the week, we are scattered all over this province - Saskatchewan, and maybe even further in the country. But, here we are brought together. Here we are the Body of Christ made visible. Here we lay down our differences and become one family. We must try to rise above the things that prevent us from experiencing and expressing our unity - shyness, coldness, and indifference.

Jesus gave himself for our salvation. This was God's ultimate expression of his love for us. This is the reason and meaning of today's solemnity. Our profession of the reality and truth of Jesus' Body and Blood in the Eucharist is our expression of recognition of God's love. Love is the atmosphere we breathe here.

“The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church. The Church which is the Body of Christ participates in the offering of her Head. With him, she herself is offered whole and entire. She unites herself to his intercession with the Father for all men. In the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ becomes also the sacrifice of the members of his Body. The lives of the faithful, their praise, sufferings, prayer, and work, are united with those of Christ and with his total offering, and so acquire a new value. Christ's sacrifice present on the altar makes it possible for all generations of Christians to be united with his offering.” (CCC: 1368)

Thus, we believe that in the Eucharist, the bread and wine become his Body and Blood and are not mere symbols. God, in the Spirit, and in Jesus Christ, offers himself to us to be eaten and drank.

It is a sustained offering of love. The question is, do we respond to him with love? If we do, we have to begin by receiving him in faith in his table. It is for this reason that we are required to confess and be reconciled to God before we receive him in communion. We need also be in good terms with one another.

Unfortunately, sometimes when we leave the church we tend to forget all this. We no longer recognise the ties that exist between us. We go our own ways, ignoring one another, and sadly sometimes turning against one another. When we depart from here we must take out into the world some of the warmth we have experienced here – the bond/warmth of love.
