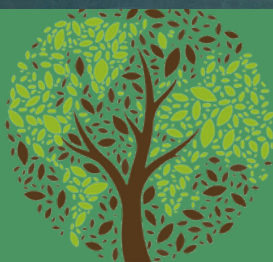
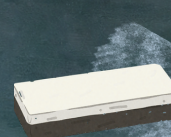

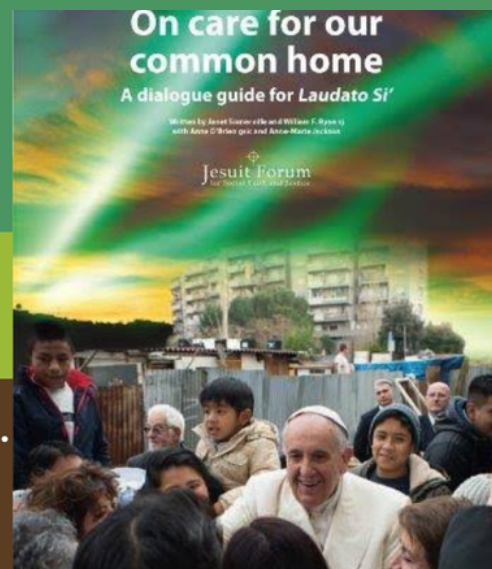

23rd Sunday: My brothers' keeper

"Corrections are good, they keep us all humble." Cathie Wood

Today's gospel wants us to find a way of uniting with each other regardless of how difficult and stressful it might be. Although conflicts are inevitable in our relationships, within our families and communities; we must learn to manage them as Christians. We must learn to counsel and talk over issues, to see things from the perspective of others.

Jesus said, 'If your brother/sister does something wrong, go and have it out with him/her alone' (Matthew 18:15). He doesn't say, 'Put up with it, suffer it, endure it.' He says, 'Go and politely confront him/her with his/her wrong-doing. Let us not forget that Jesus also said, "If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them" (Luke 6:29). The emphasis here is maintaining the balance, 'Virtue is in the middle' - (*In mediō stat virtūs*).

Earnestly speaking, to confront another person is a difficult thing and calls for courage and wisdom. If we do it in anger and in a vengeful frame of mind, in all probability it will be counter-productive. We have to do it not just out of concern for ourselves and the hurt caused to us, but out of concern for the other person. It should be done as a way of showing love for him/her.

There is an art in confronting a person politely. If we adopt a harsh approach with someone, all we do is cause him/her to harden his/her heart. In that case, not only is nothing achieved, but further harm is done. Whereas if we adopt a gentler approach, we may soften his/her heart, help him/her to see the error of his/her ways, and so enable him/her to change.

We are responsible for one another, but the duty to speak out falls most heavily on the head of the family, leaders in the church and community. We should not remain silent, when silence can be taken to mean that we approve of what is happening. In that case we share in being responsible for the evil. Prophet Ezekiel was called to be a watcher for the house of Israel. He spoke/propheesied to them, not out of arrogance, but out of genuine humility and care for them (Ezekiel 33:7-9).

We don't show love for someone if we allow him/her to do wrong at all time. By hurting others, she/he is also damaging himself/herself. So, it is in his/her interest that she/he desists from what she/he is doing.

Besides, to watch someone doing wrong, and not try to stop him/her, is to bear part of the responsibility for the wrong she/he is doing.

If we counsel the offender in the right spirit, and she/he is genuine, she/he will want to put things right. The objective is not to score a victory over our brother/sister, but to win him/her over, to be reconciled with him/her. Perhaps the person is not aware that she/he is doing wrong.

Dialogue fosters mutual respect for one another; it saves us a lot of energy and time. It also fosters mutual love and restores relationships. It helps us to discover how related we are as part of God's family. And through dialogue, we can win more souls to Jesus by becoming more aware of the weakness of others and helping them to turn back to God.
